List of Hazardous and Banned Substances

The maximum concentration values for the banned substances are:

- Lead and Lead Compounds – 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials. (normally in solder, PVC cable)
- Mercury and Mercury Compounds - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials (normally in plastics, lamps, relays)
- Hexavalent Chromium Compounds - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials. (normally in surface coatings, colorant)
- PolyBrominated Biphenyls (PBBs) - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials (flame retardants)
- PolyBrominated Diphenyl (Diphenyl) Ethers [PBB (D) Es] - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials (flame retardants)
- Cadmium and Cadmium Compounds - 100 ppm (0.01 weight %) in homogenous materials (normally in paints, lacquers, stabilizers).

- Bis (2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP) - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials.
- Butyl Benzyl phthalate (BBP) - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials.
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP) - 1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials.
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP) -1000 ppm (0.1 weight %) in homogenous materials.

Compliant with Exemptions: 6c, 7a

- 6(c) Copper alloy containing up to 4% lead by weight.
- 7(a) Lead in high melting temperature type solders (i.e. lead-based alloys containing 85% by weight or more lead).
